The Accounting Revolution: Transforming Challenges into Opportunities



The National Catholic Education Commission (NCEC) organized a three-day workshop for accountants from Catholic Board of Education (CBE) and Diocesan Board of Education (DBE) schools, held at Hotel dGates, Lahore, from October 9 to 11, 2024. The event focused on enhancing financial management skills and promote effective practices within educational institutions.

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Day 1 Highlights

The event began with Mr. Asher Javaid's session on Building an Effective Finance Team, emphasizing the importance of teamwork and communication. This was followed by Mr. Maxwell's presentation on Using Financial Information for Organizational Growth, where he encouraged participants to adopt strategic financial analysis.

Day one wrapped up with Mrs. Romeen Aneel and Mr. Rizwan John reviewing key Financial Procedures, including school financial statements and budgets.

Day 2 Highlights

The second day featured visits to St. Anthony's High School Lawrence Rd. Lahore and St. Thomas High School Makkah Colony, where accountants learned about fee management systems and ERP software integration. They also toured Syntecho Soft, exploring data security and software customization.



Day 3 Highlights

On the final day, participants delved into EOBI & Social Security, gaining insights into employee benefits, followed by a review of Cash and Accrual Accounting session presented by Mrs. Romeen Aneel. Mr. Rizwan John conducted practical sessions on Updating MIS & Filing WHT Statements and Taxation and Filing Tax Returns.

Mr. Asher concluded the workshop by thanking participants for their engagement. Attendees left equipped with valuable skills to enhance financial practices in their institutions.

Active engagement was a hallmark, with educators eagerly asking questions, sharing ideas, and completing practice assignments. Mr. Saimon Robin guided participants in designing educational newsletters, sparking lively discussions.











Several participants, including Ms. Sarah Arif and Mr. Saimon Robin, completed the Canva for Teachers certification, demonstrating their commitment to growth. The workshop ended with participants eager to apply their new skills, anticipating a positive impact on their teaching.

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Wrap-Up of STEM Training Program by Science Fuse

The National Catholic Education Commission (NCEC) celebrated the successful conclusion of the "Science Sab Kay Liye" STEM training program, expertly facilitated by Science Fuse. Running from January 2024 to January 2025, this initiative aimed to empower educators across all dioceses in Pakistan to enhance their teaching methodologies and engage students in dynamic and meaningful science education.







The program featured a series of workshops designed to equip teachers with innovative tools and strategies, fostering curiosity and critical thinking in students. Key sessions included hands-on activities, such as the Science Capital Map, storytelling workshops, and inquiry-based learning techniques. Notably, the program culminated in a Online and face-to-face session sessions, where 36 participants gathered to share experiences and build connections within the STEM teaching community.

NCEC extends heartfelt appreciation to the Science Fuse team for their dedication and expertise in conducting these training workshops. Their efforts have laid the groundwork for the first STEM teams in each diocese, promising a transformative impact on teaching practices and student engagement in science across the nation.




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3rd Annual FCC Science Fair: "Innovation and Artology"
