
ONLINE TRAINING ON RENEWABLE ENERGY RESOURCES

As part of our ongoing commitment to sustainability and environmental stewardship, a group of four participants from Pakistan, Mr. Asher Javaid, Mr. Maxwell Shanti, Mr. Snawer Gill and Ms. Sunita Shaukat participated in an online training program on Renewable Energy Resources arranged by Tulip in collaboration with BEGECA. This professional development opportunity, held from 8th to 11th July 2025, brought together participants from across our Catholic communities around the globe with a shared goal: to better understand the role of renewable energy in caring for our common home.

The training covered a range of topics including solar, wind, hydro, and bioenergy, as well as the importance of transitioning towards clean energy solutions in the face of climate change. Through a series of interactive sessions, participants explored the science behind renewable energy technologies, the economic and environmental benefits, and practical ways to integrate sustainability into school practices and learning environments.

Participants described the training as inspiring, informative, and highly relevant, especially in light of Pope Francis' call in Laudato Si' to take urgent action to protect our planet. The sessions also offered a platform for meaningful dialogue around how Catholic schools can model ecological responsibility and lead by example in their communities.

A 6 - DAY ACCOUNTANTS WORKSHOP

REFRESH, REVISE & RECHARGE FOR STRONGER FINANCIAL PRACTICES

The National Catholic Education Commission (NCEC), Pakistan, successfully organized a 6-day workshop titled "Accounting Insight: Refresh, Revise and Recharge" from 14th to 19th July 2025 at The Salvation Army Territorial Headquarters, Lahore.

Accountants representing Catholic Board of Education (CBE) and Diocesan Board of Education (DBE) offices from across the country actively participated, with engaging presentations delivered by representatives from Lahore, Quetta, Hyderabad, Multan,

Karachi, Faisalabad, and Islamabad/Rawalpindi.

Covering topics such as effective financial management, accounting principles, business communication, taxation, budget preparation, QuickBooks, ERP systems, and procurement policies, the workshop not only refreshed participants' knowledge but also strengthened uniform practices across diocesan institutions.

Group discussions and collaborative presentations fostered peer learning, while the finalization of a Daily Fee Collection Format and the decision to hold biannual meetings marked important steps toward sustainable financial development in Catholic education.



The workshop served as a platform to refresh, revise, and recharge skills, ensuring accountants are better equipped to manage resources effectively for the future.

STEM MASTER TRAINER WORKSHOPS BUILDING FOUNDATIONS FOR STEM CLUBS

As part of Stage 2: Setting Up STEM Clubs, the National Catholic Education Commission (NCEC), in collaboration with Science Fuse, conducted the second phase of STEM Master Trainer workshops between August and September 2025. These sessions aimed to strengthen the pedagogical skills, creativity, and facilitation capacity of STEM trainers to establish effective and inclusive STEM Clubs across Catholic schools in Pakistan.

The Lahore workshop, held on August 21–22, 2025, at OBAN Hotel, Gulberg III, brought together participants from CBE Lahore, Faisalabad, Multan, and DBE Rawalpindi. The session was facilitated by Mr. Waqas Nasir, Mr. Shayan Moazzam, and Ms. Kalsoom from the Science Fuse Karachi team. The Rawalpindi workshop, conducted on September 4–5, 2025, at the Christian Study Centre, engaged master trainers from CBE Karachi, Hyderabad, and Quetta, led by Mr. Qumber Abidi, Senior Trainer and Advisor at Science Fuse.

NCEC commends all master trainers and facilitators for their commitment to fostering curiosity and scientific thinking among young learners, paving the way for a stronger, more equitable STEM culture in Catholic schools across Pakistan.

PEEP INTO THE FUTURE ALFOR EDUCATORS WORKSHOP

The National Catholic Education Commission (NCEC) organized a two-day face-to-face workshop titled "AI for Educators" under the theme Peep into the Future on September 6–7, 2025, at the NCEC Office. Facilitated by Mr. Saimon Robin, this 10-hour training brought together 19 Teacher Educators, Master Trainers, and STEM members from all dioceses, with an apology from CBE Faisalabad.







The workshop aimed to help educators understand the fundamentals of Artificial Intelligence in education and its potential to enhance teaching and learning. By the end of the sessions, participants were able to organize, store, and share classroom resources using Google Drive, leverage Gemini for lesson planning and content creation, and critically reflect on the ethical and pedagogical impacts of AI tools

Through hands-on activities and discussions, teachers explored how Al can foster creativity, save time, and support diverse learning needs—preparing them to integrate innovative digital tools effectively in their classrooms. This initiative marked a forward-looking step by NCEC toward building digital readiness among Catholic educators across Pakistan.

THE TEACHER TRAINER COURSE

The School Leaders Course (SLC) contains six modules, it is 80-hour program, it began with an orientation on August 22, 2025, welcoming 35 participants from all seven dioceses.







THE TRAINER DEVELOPMENT COURSE



- THE ARTWORK MUST BE TWO-DIMENSIONAL (2D); 3D ART WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

- EACH ARTWORK MUST CLEARLY INCLUDE THE STUDENT NAME, CLASS, SCHOOL, AND THE RESPECTIVE CATHOLIC/DIOCESAN BOARD OF EDUCATION (CBE/DBE).
- EACH CBE/DBE MAY SUBMIT A MAXIMUM OF FIVE (5) ARTWORKS PER GROUP.
- ALL ARTWORKS MUST BE CREATED IN SCHOOL UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF A TEACHER.
- ONCE SUBMITTED, ALL ARTWORKS WILL REMAIN WITH NCEC.
- NCEC WILL NOT BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY TRANSPORTATION DAMAGE PRIOR TO EVALUATION.
- DETAILED MARKING CRITERIA WILL NOT BE SHARED; ONLY THE FINAL POSITIONS WILL
